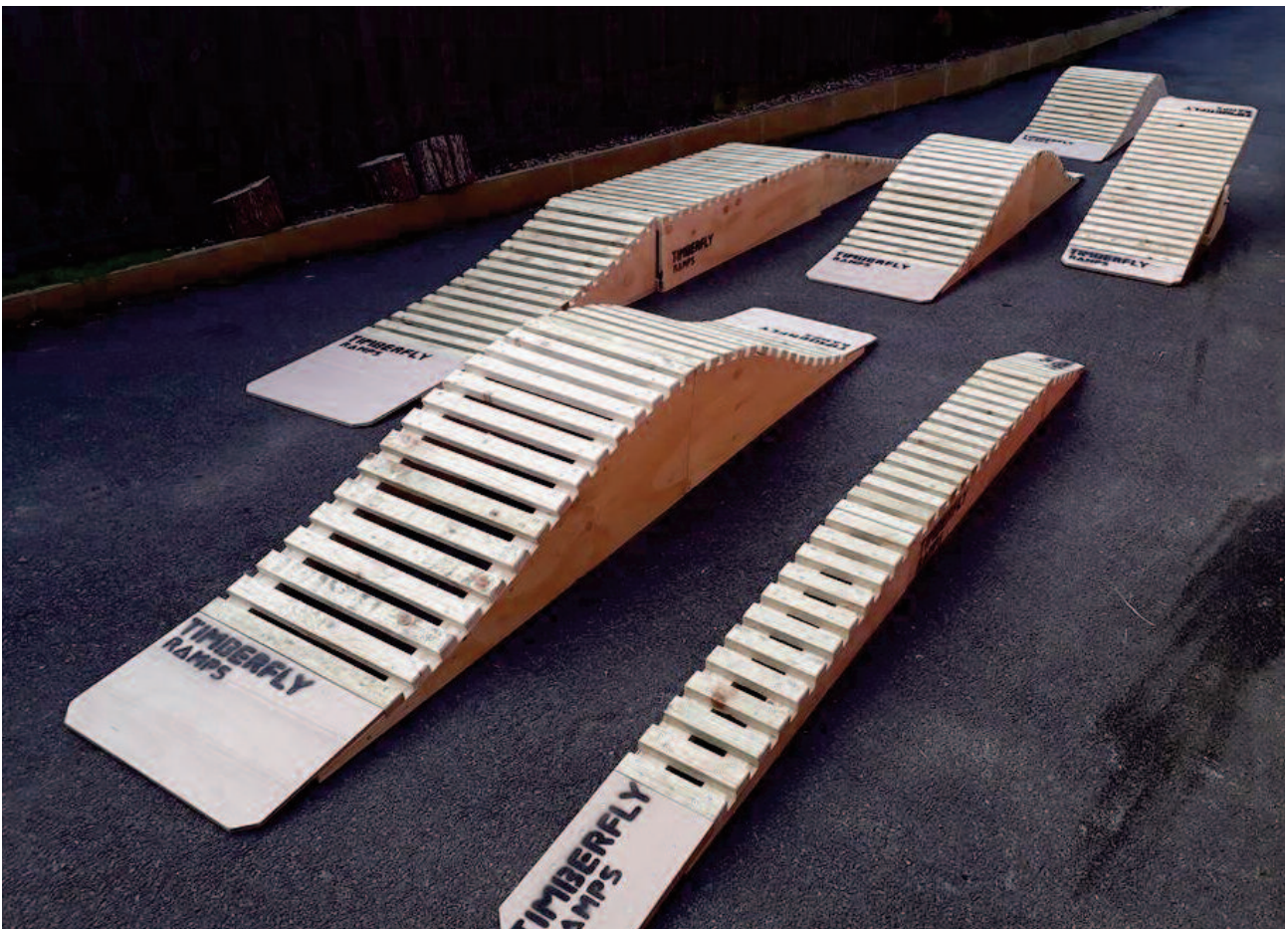

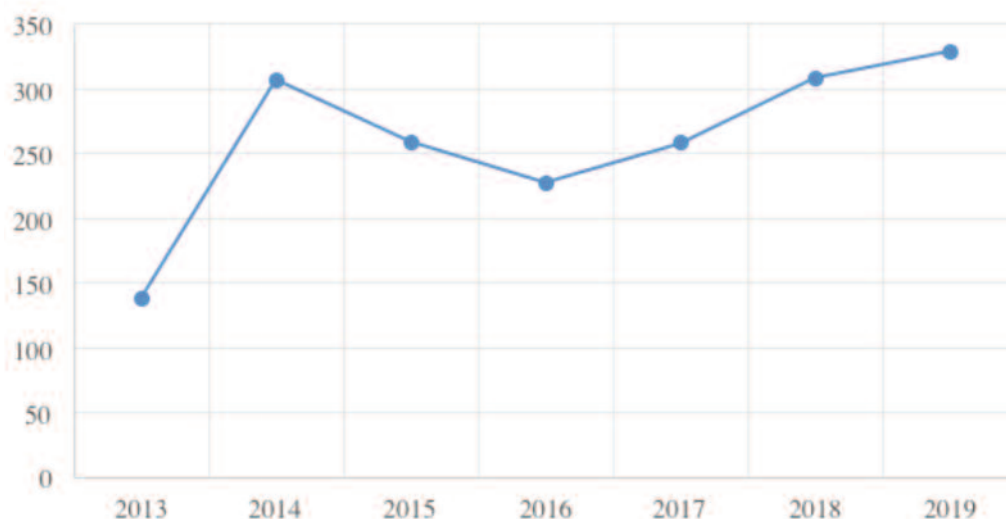

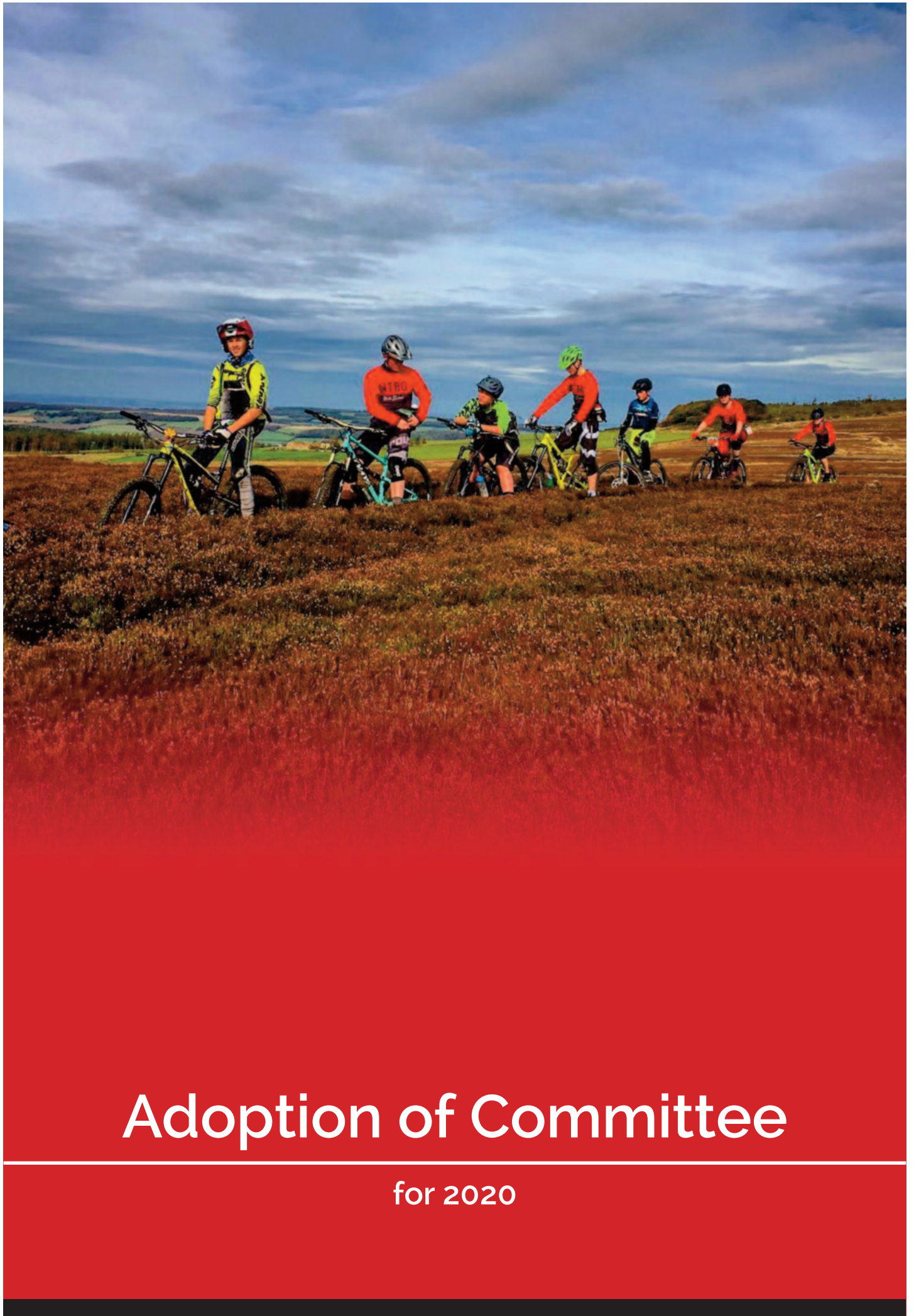

Introduction By Nick Piper (Chairman)

Nick opened the meeting and thanked volunteers for their hard work over the past two seasons.

Membership Report

Dan covered the membership report. Numbers are still fairly steady and around the 140 members mark. There has been a slight increase in adult memberships, and a rise in junior memberships.

Treasurers Report

Lois covered the club's incoming and outgoing funds. These have been fairly consistent again, with money being invested in the ramps, and club kit. Lois also brought to the floors attention that we could change bank accounts to Santander, with a benefit of a £750 reward. The committee were in agreement that this was a good idea, and Nick gave his authorisation to proceed.

Racing Report

Nick covered the last two seasons racing successes of club members, with special note to Chris Rudd for his 24 hour successes, and the junior members who have gone onto great enduro achievements.

Events

Nick covered the events report. The events we have attended were a great success, but unfortunately we didn't make a couple of events in 2019 due to the weather. We plan to continue events where we can, but may negotiate a better deal for the likes of Ardrock.

Coaching & Guiding

Well done to volunteers who have qualified or continued their development in the last couple of years. There are still some volunteers actively training and we are looking to encourage and support others.

Kate asked if we could run another junior advanced skills session, such as the one previously ran at Dirt School. This was a great success and helped those who attended further their riding. We will look at this for 2020.

It was noted there is a lack of adult sessions again. It was opened to the floor for ideas and was suggested that core skills sessions would be a good idea. We will look to add something to our 2020 calendar.

It was also suggested that we could have some further coaching sessions, either at LJS or within the forest for new junior riders. Currently we coach them at the beginning of the year, but do not follow up afterwards. Again we will discuss and see if anything can be added to the 2020 calendar.

Junior Report

Another successful year of junior rides. We have had 325 riders over the course of 20 rides so far in 2019. The August Summer School for under 10's was successful yet again. A special thanks to Sam Faulkner and Jacob Rudd for helping out at the sessions. It was asked if we could have some sort of follow on from these sessions. Again this is something we will look at for 2020, with regards to location, structure, and volunteers numbers.

Any Other Business

Some parents are saying they have not been getting emails. Dan has recently updated the Juniors email list. If there are any queries please ask parents to email me and I will add them to the list.

As an alternative form of emergency communication for junior rides, such as when we cancel a ride last minute, could we set up an SMS system? This is to be investigated to see if there is a cheap/free system we could use.

Nick asked the juniors present for their thoughts. They agreed that they would like to do some away days, such as Dalby or Hamsterley. We have done these in the past so we need to investigate access to the bike trailer at LJS, and mini bus hire with a towbar.

We have previously spoken about sessions with the local Mountain Rescue team at Great Ayton. They are keen to help us learn how to deal with an incident, and get feedback for themselves on dealing with MTB incidents. They have also invited us to attend their base with some juniors to have a look around.

It was suggested that we could look at organising a cycle maintenance course/session. This would be aimed at beginners looking to maintain their bikes and basic trailside repairs. Nick suggested Rich Wilson (Shimano Tech) might be keen on helping with these sessions.
